

<p>Description of activity Halloween toilet roll monster fun</p>	<p>Equipment required Empty toilet rolls, tubes or card made into tubes, coloured paper, paint, glue and googly eyes</p>														
<p>Instructions Make up some examples of the monsters so the children can see what to do. Prep the different shapes for the hair, wings etc Get the children to paint their character and then let them dry. The older children could help cut out the other parts with safety scissors. Have some ready painted or covered in coloured paper to save time. Stick on the faces and hair etc. The bats need the ends of the tubes pushed in to complete the shape and then their wings stuck on.
