

Description of activity

Rocking Paper Plate Submarine

Equipment required

Paper Plate, Blue tissue paper, colouring pens (yellow mainly but others also needed for windows etc), either fish stickers or little fish you can cut out and stick on

Instructions

This activity can spark a good conversation with the children about the sea, what's in the sea, how people can see deep down etc

Each child has 1 paper plate each. The plate needs to be folded in half so it creates the rocking part of the sub.

You will need to pre draw and cut out the top part of the sub ready to stick on.

Get the children to stick bits of blue tissue paper to the bottom curved bit to replicate the sea and colour in the yellow part adding in the windows. If you have some fish stickers or cut out little fish to stick on to make it look like it's in the middle of the sea.

Once completed you can stand it up and it should rock back and forwards.

EYFS benefits

a fun activity of a submarine, talk about why we have submarines, what they are used for and how they can go really low in the sea. be creative and fun by adding fish or sealife around the sub.
